Reply from Sandy Grant: re: Lumphanan playing field – "The playing field has a problem at the lower end next to the ditch which is probably higher than the field and getting the ditch cleared is a problem as it is under the old railway bridge and in between houses further down stream which we can not get at. The pitch could be turned round to run across and abandon the lower end of the Park". Those present at the meeting noted that this was not a satisfactory answer has the problem had been resolved in the past. RB to speak to Sandy Grant again. 6. Stuart Ranford (Planning Inspector) response to Councillor Peter Argyll – "With reference to the material in the field next to the monument, this site was formally owned by Scottish Water but recently sold to Mr Brown Lumphanan, who removed this material from within the site whilst	RB

	attempting to plough it. He has sowed the area with barley and it is his intention to bring in a mobile crushing machine to crush this and remove it from the site. I have advised him of the status of the monument and in particular the tourist attraction and he is aware of this and will attempt to move it as soon as practicable. From the Planning side as this has come from within the site used for agriculture there is no formal action i can take other than to monitor it and keep in touch with him and gently use my powers of persuasion to get him to comply. His telephone number is 07876031158 he say's you are welcome to call him should the need arise.  7. SD had contacted SEPA regarding the above to obtain their views on this. The response received was that he had no exemption to store the stones on the site and that SEPA would investigate further. SD to follow up with SEPA for any further response.  8. Roads Street Lighting - reply from Ralph Singleton: "The Street Lighting Defects records show that 1 of the lights on the Burnside road has a recorded fault, but I will go home that way today and check the rest. The overnight lighting scouting has been discontinued for budgetary reasons, so we rely on the public to report lighting defects. These should be reported to the Contact Centre number on 08456 08 12 05. I would be grateful if you could pass this on to the LCC. SD noticed that from correspondence subsequently received this month from Les Allan that there is now a web based system for reporting such faults. As there has been no movement following JS reporting this twice by telephone SD has now registered it as a fault online.  9. Trees – reply from Ralph Singleton. 7	Veena Fernandez – Parent Council  VF attended the meeting and spoke on behalf of the Parent Council with	
	regards to parking around the school location. There has apparently been a focus on getting parents to walk their children to school and to reduce the risk of potential accidents when too many cars were parked around the area close to the school gates. The LCC was asked if they had any suggestions to alleviate this problem.  The consensus view was that the provision of more parking spaces would be counter-productive in that it would encourage more people to drive. With Millan View being a cul de sac the problem would not disappear by increasing parking spaces. The simplest way may be to make the road to the school a	
	full no-parking or no waiting area during school opening hours. There is generally room to park around the village (e.g. in The Square or outside of the Macbeth Hotel).
